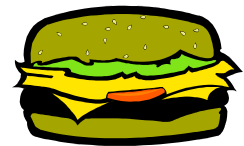

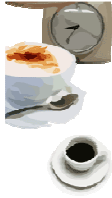
Those who attended the first Wednesday Night Dinner and Program had a great time singing along with Ann Miles at the piano.

It's getting closer. Our time for the Grand Strand Pack-A-Thon is October 15 at 9am. We will need to get to the Sun News warehouse by 8:45am. There is a brief instruction time, then we will pack lunches for 1 1/2 hours and then a 10 minute overview at the end.

Each meal costs just 26 cents to produce, ship and distribute to one child. Our team of 17 people will produce 4,000 meals or \$1040 worth of food

which is just \$62 per person. If you are participating on the church team, please make your check of \$62 per person payable to the church and drop it off to Linda in the church office.
